- OA Journal Publishing Tools integrated with Institutional Repository
- Part of Elsevier family of Research Products since 2017



Today Digital Commons supports over 500 institutions and nearly 2000 journals



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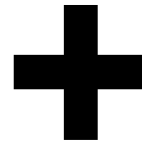





A **social theory of numeracy** can reflect the realities of change by incorporating change into the **theory** and purposefully resisting a fixed definition of **numeracy**. The **social practices** that make up **numeracy**, then, are continually open to scrutiny, replacement, and refinement.

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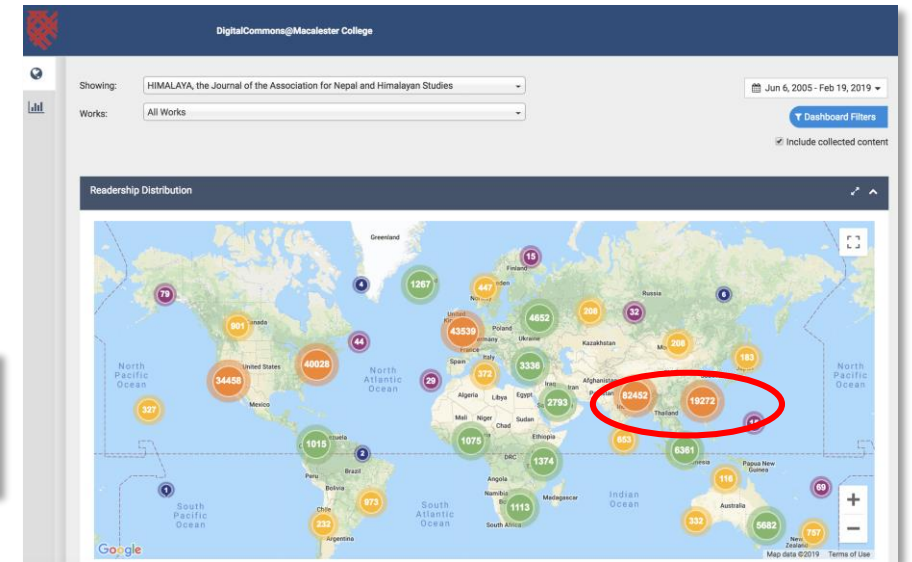
